

GARD Guide Characteristics

- Be flexible to accommodate site-specific issues
- Use proven, field tested technologies
- Founded on a risk-based approach
- Endorse a proactive approach encouraging acid reduction and control at the source
- Be a "how to" guide and not a regulatory tool or a design manual
- Address the full life cycle of a mine
- Avoid duplication and build on existing publications


GARD Guide Roll Out

- In January 2010, INAP met with:
 - IFC to discuss integration of the GARD Guide into IFC Environmental Guidelines on Mining
 - US EPA requesting Guide review and support with other governmental agencies
 - US National Mining Association to promote Guide training and usage with NMA members

GARD Guide Roll Out Objectives

- Develop a working relationship with ICMM to provide ARD technical support
- Work with Mining Associations to promote Guide usage
- Add new INAP members
- Facilitate new members of Global Alliance in BRIC Countries
- Facilitate translation to other languages with technical review
- Assist regulatory agencies with Guide training
- Work with companies to integrate the Guide into their EMS programs
